Please, when you come to the priory at the present time, respect social distancing, avoid physical contact, use hand gel on arrival, do not exchange the Peace physically. There will not be any singing, though we shall use recorded music, and Holy Communion will be given in just one kind. Please pay careful attention to directions from the 'Sidesmen', and to marked routes in the church.

Organ music is played before the service begins. When the sacristy bell is rung, please stand. We hear the choir singing

The CELEBRANT greets the people

The CELEBRANT welcomes the people and introduces the Confession.

The CELEBRANT pronounces the Absolution. All sit as the choir sings, in Latin, (Missa a 4 - Monteverdi)

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

When the Gloria ends, all stand for the special prayer of the Day called the Collect.

## All sit for The First Reading: Wisdom 12:13,16-19

here is no god, other than you, who cares for every thing, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly; Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all.

You show your strength when your sovereign power is guestioned and you expose

the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there. By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance. ## ¶ SIT. A SERMON is preached, and then STAND for the Creed. (Remember just to listen and reflect. Do not sing)

and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost the Lord, the Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spake by the Prophets. And I believe one holy Catholic and Apostolic Church; I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

The CELEBRANT introduces the Intercessions.

The CELEBRANT says the Prayer over the gifts .....Amen.

All stand for the Eucharistic Prayer. (Remain seated if necessary)

The Lord be with you. And also with you Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues... All say

Holy, holy, holy Lord. God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues...

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues... At the conclusion all say **Amen!** 

All kneel or sit. The Priest introduces the Lord's Prayer

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Stand. The Celebrant says the Post-Communion prayer, and all then say

Imighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

All sit for the notices and stand for the Blessing and Dismissal.

The Lord be with you. And also with you. .......Amen. Go in the peace of Christ. Thanks be to God.

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
